TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Definitions

1. In these Terms and Conditions:

'Contract' means a contract between the Supplier and the Customer for the supply of Goods and/or Services and is comprised of the Supplier's quotation (together with all documents attached to the quotation) and these Terms and Conditions.

'Confidential Information' means information that (i) is by its nature confidential; (ii) is designated by the Supplier to be confidential; or (iii) the Customer knows or ought to know is confidential, relating to the Goods or the Supplier's business which is not in the public domain, including trade secrets, know-how, scientific, technical, product, market or pricing information.

'Customer' means the person, firm, organisation, partnership, corporation, trustee of a trust or other entity (including its successors and permitted assigns) to whom Goods and/or Services are provided by the Supplier.

'Customer Material' means any and all information, specifications, data, and documents provided by the Customer to the Supplier (whether in hard copy or in an electronic format) in the course of the Supplier supplying the Goods and/or Services.

'Goods' means all goods supplied by the Supplier to the Customer (and where the context so permits shall include any supply of Services as hereinafter defined) and as are described on the invoices, quotation, or any other forms as provided by the Supplier to the Customer.

'GST' has the meaning given to it by *A New Tax System (Goods and Services Tax) Act 1999* (Cth).

'Intellectual Property Rights' means all intellectual property rights throughout the world, whether present or future, including rights in relation to copyright, trade secrets, know how, trade marks (whether registered or unregistered or whether in word or logo/device form), designs, patents and patentable inventions, including the right to apply for registration of any such rights.

'Order' means a signed quotation from the Customer requesting the supply of Goods and/or Services.

'PPSA' means the *Personal Property Securities Act 2009* (Cth).

'PPSR' means the Personal Property Securities Register.

'Price' means the Price payable for the Goods and/or the Services as determined in accordance with clause 2.

'Services' means all services supplied by the Supplier to the Customer (and where the context so permits shall include any supply of Goods as described above).

'Supplier' means Roofeze Pty Ltd ABN 43 284 699 185 and its Related Bodies Corporate (as that term is defined in the *Corporations Act 2001*).

'Supplier IP' means all Intellectual Property Rights in and in relation to:

- Confidential Information;
- all documents, reports, software, patents and patentable inventions relating to the Goods; and
- Works.

'Works' means all literary, artistic and other works, including all physical works, production materials and subject matter created solely or jointly with others, by the Supplier in the course of or in relation to the Contract in which Intellectual Property Rights may subsist and all drafts, variations, alterations and adaptations of such works or subject matter (whether currently existing or created in the future).

'Terms and Conditions' means these terms and conditions (as amended from time to time).

Price and Payment terms

2. The Price shall be the Supplier's quoted Price (subject to clauses 9 and 13 to 15), which shall be binding on the Supplier provided the Customer accepts the quotation in writing within the period specified in clause 9.

3. Where the Contract is for the supply of Goods only, payment of the Price must be made on or before delivery of the Goods. The Supplier may, in its sole discretion, withhold despatch of the Goods (or any part of the Goods) if the Customer fails to make any payment in accordance with the terms of the Contract as and when due.

4. Where the Contract is for the supply of Services, payment of the Price must be made (at the Supplier's option):

- before the commencement of the Services;
- immediately upon completion of the Services; or
- by the date nominated by the Supplier's invoice.

5. Notwithstanding clauses 3 and 4, the Supplier reserves the right to issue an invoice at any point in time, notwithstanding whether the Contract been completed or not.

6. The Customer must check all invoices and advise the Supplier of any errors or omissions within seven (7) days of receipt. Failing advice from the Customer that the invoice contains any errors or omissions, the invoice may be deemed accepted by the Supplier.

7. Should the Customer not pay for the Goods and/or Services supplied by the Supplier in accordance with the Contract, or as agreed in writing by the Supplier and Customer from time to time, after issuing a written demand to the Customer demanding payment within fourteen (14) days, the Supplier will be entitled to charge an administration fee of ten (10) percent of the amount outstanding in respect of the Goods and/or Services.

8. The Customer acknowledges that the Supplier shall be at liberty to charge a surcharge for credit card transactions equal to the merchant fees incurred by the Supplier.

Formation of Contract

9. Quotations are exclusive of GST and shall remain valid for a period of thirty (30) days from the date of quotation, unless otherwise specified in writing. The Supplier, in its sole discretion, reserves the right to withdraw, vary or extend any quotation at any time prior to the formation of a Contract in accordance with clause 11.

10. Unless specified otherwise, insofar as quotations relate to the provision of Services, the Price shall be based upon the Services being performed during normal working hours on business days. If requested by the Customer, the Supplier may from time to time agree to perform Services outside of normal working hours and/or business days, in which case such Services will be deemed a variation and will be charged by the Supplier in accordance with clause 16.

11. Quotations made by the Supplier are estimates only and will not be construed as an offer or obligation to supply in accordance with the quotation. The Supplier reserves the right to accept or reject, at its discretion, any Order. Only written acceptance by the Supplier of an Order will complete a Contract.

12. At the Supplier's sole discretion, a deposit may be required. The deposit amount or percentage of the price due will be stipulated at the time of the order of the Goods and/or Services and shall immediately become due and payable upon the formation of a Contract in accordance with clause 11. For the purposes of clarity, where a deposit is requested, the Supplier is under no obligation to supply Goods and/or Services until the deposit has been received by the Supplier in cleared funds.

Variations

13. Where the Customer requests or directs that any Goods and/or Services be supplied that are not strictly in accordance with the Order, then such Goods and/or Services shall constitute a variation, unless otherwise agreed between the parties.

14. The Customer understands and agrees that:

- all variations must be agreed between the parties in writing prior to the Goods and/or Services being supplied; and
- all variations shall be, at the Supplier's discretion, invoiced at the rate(s) specified in the quotation, as specifically quoted, or in accordance with the Supplier's current prevailing rates (as amended from time to time).

15. Notwithstanding clauses 13 and 14, and subject to any rights the Customer might have under any relevant legislation, the Supplier reserves the right to vary the quoted price if:

- there is any movement in the cost of supplying the Goods and/or Services specified in the Order (including, without limitation, any actual increase in the costs to the Supplier in manufacturing, procuring or transporting the Goods, and/or actual increases in labour in connection with the supply of the Goods and/or Services);
- where additional Services are required due to the discovery of hidden or unidentifiable issues (including, without limitation, issues, faults and/or problems identified upon further inspection) which have been discovered following the commencement of the Services;
- otherwise as provided for in these Terms and Conditions.

Provision of Services

16. Where the Supplier has been engaged to supply and install the Goods, the Customer acknowledges that it must ensure that site amenities required by the Supplier, including, but not limited to, water, electricity and sanitary accommodation (i.e. serviced toilet facilities) are provided for the Supplier's use (at no expense to the Supplier).

17. The Customer acknowledges and understands that:

- any estimate for performance or completion of the Services provided by the Supplier is an estimate only;
- unless specified by the Supplier in writing, the Supplier does not make any warranty or representation that it will be capable of providing the Services within any timeframe(s) specified by the Customer;
- it is not relieved from any obligation arising under these Terms and Conditions by reason of any delay in performance or completion of the Services; and
- the Supplier may suspend or cease performance of the Services at any time upon written notice to the Customer if, in the reasonable opinion of the Supplier, it would be unsafe for any person for the Supplier to provide (or continue to provide) Services at the Customer's nominated site.

18. The Customer:

- acknowledges that it must obtain, and provide to the Supplier, all things necessary for the Supplier to perform the Services in a timely manner; and
- inform the Supplier of any special requirements pertaining to performance of the Services (including, without limitation, site-specific requirements and safety requirements).

Site access

19. The Customer acknowledges that it shall at all reasonable times permit the Supplier (including its contractors, agents and employees) to have free, clear and unrestricted access to the site where the Services are to be provided to enable the Supplier to fulfil its obligations under the Contract without unreasonable interruption, impediment, delay or obstruction.

20. In the event that free, clear and unrestricted access to the site is not available to the Supplier in accordance with clause 19, the Supplier reserves the right to suspend or cease performance of the of Services upon the provision of written notice to the Customer.

21. The Customer agrees to indemnify the Supplier from any and all costs and penalties (including claims for liquidated damages) if the completion of the Services is delayed due to interrupted site access.

Delivery

22. The Customer shall be liable for all costs associated with delivery, including freight, insurance, handling and other charges, unless otherwise agreed in writing.

23. The Customer acknowledges and accepts that any period or date for delivery stated by the Supplier is intended as an estimate only and is not a contractual commitment. The Supplier will not in any circumstances be liable for any loss or damage suffered by the Customer or any third party for failure to meet any estimated delivery.

24. Delivery will be made within normal business hours between Monday to Friday, 6.00am to 6.00pm only (unless otherwise agreed to in writing).

25. Delivery is deemed to occur at the earlier of:

- the collection of Goods from the Supplier by the Customer or any third party on behalf of the Customer;
- the time of loading of Goods at the Supplier's premises for the purpose of delivery to the Customer.

26. The Supplier is entitled to charge a reasonable fee for storage and/or redelivery charges in the event the Customer does not, or is unable to, accept delivery of the Goods.

27. The Customer accepts that the Supplier may deliver Goods by instalments and require payment for each separate instalment in accordance with the Contract.

28. The Customer acknowledges and accepts that it is not relieved from any obligation arising under the Contract by reason of any delay in delivery.

Returns

29. The Customer must inspect the Goods immediately upon delivery and must within seven (7) days after the date of inspection give written notice to the Supplier with particulars, of any claim that the Goods are not in accordance with the Contract. Further, the Customer must, upon request from the Supplier, allow the Supplier to enter upon any premises occupied by the Customer to inspect the Goods that are subject of the claim. If the Customer fails to give notice or refuses to allow the Supplier to inspect the Goods, then to the extent permitted by law, the Goods must be treated as having been accepted by the Customer (and the Customer shall have no claim against the Supplier for damage or non-conformity of the Goods with the Contract and the Customer must pay for the Goods in accordance with the Contract.

30. The Customer cannot return Goods to the Supplier without the written agreement of the Supplier.

31. After inspection has taken place as provided for by clause 29 (but subject to clause 30):

- if the Supplier reasonably determines that:
 - the Goods are not damaged; or
 - the Goods were damaged by the Customer or the Customer failed to take reasonable steps to prevent the Goods from becoming damaged; and
 - the Goods are otherwise in conformity with the Contract,the Customer is deemed to have accepted the Goods and the Supplier is entitled to the Price.
- if the Supplier reasonably determines that:
 - the Goods are damaged; and
 - the Goods were not damaged by the Customer and the Customer did not fail to take reasonable steps to prevent the Goods from becoming damaged; or
 - the Goods are otherwise not in conformity with the Contract,the Customer is entitled to any one or more, at the option of the Supplier:
 - the replacement of the Goods or the supply of equivalent Goods;
 - the repair of the Goods;
 - the payment of the cost of replacing the Goods or acquiring equivalent Goods;
 - the payment of the cost of having the Goods repaired.

32. Where Goods are the subject of a notice under clause 29:

- The Customer must leave the Goods in the state and condition in which they were delivered until such time as the Supplier or its duly authorised agent has inspected the Goods; and
- such inspection must be carried out within a reasonable time after notification by the Customer.

33. The Customer acknowledges and agrees that any return, other than a return due to a default by the Supplier under the Contract or as otherwise permitted by law, will incur a handling and administration charge of ten (10) percent of the purchase price of the returned Goods.

34. Unless otherwise agreed in writing between the parties, the Customer must pay all costs associated with the return of any Goods (either to the Supplier or from the Supplier to the Customer or any third party) including freight, insurance, handling and other charges. Goods to be returned to the Supplier must be packed and wrapped appropriately and must include all original packaging and documentation. The Supplier accepts no liability for any damage that occurs to any Goods in return transit.
- Risk**
35. Risk of damage to or loss of the Goods passes to the Customer on delivery and the Customer must insure the Goods on or before delivery against all losses which may be sustained as a result of the loss, damage or destruction of the Goods or any part thereof by accident, theft, fire, flood, negligence and such other insurable causes as may be available and shall include the Supplier as co-insured.
36. If any of the Goods are damaged or destroyed following delivery but prior to ownership passing to the Customer, the Supplier is entitled to receive all insurance proceeds payable for the Goods to the extent of the indebtedness of the Customer to the Supplier. The production of these Terms and Conditions by the Supplier is sufficient evidence of the Supplier's rights to receive the insurance proceeds without the need for any person dealing with the Supplier to make further enquires.
37. If the Customer requests that Goods are delivered either to an unattended location, left outside, or are left outside the Supplier's premises for collection, the Customer acknowledges that the Supplier will deliver the Goods as requested at the Customer's sole risk.
- Retention of title**
38. Until such time as the Customer has made payment in full for the Goods and until such time as the Customer has made payment in full of all other money owing by the Customer to the Supplier (whether in respect of money payable under a specific Contract or on any other account whatsoever):
- title in the Goods does not pass to the Customer;
 - the Customer agrees that property and title in the Goods will not pass to the Customer and the Supplier retains the legal and equitable title in those Goods supplied and not yet sold;
 - the Customer will hold the Goods in a fiduciary capacity for the Supplier and agrees to store the Goods in such a manner that they can be identified as the property of the Supplier, and will not mix the Goods with other similar goods; and
 - the Customer will be entitled to sell the Goods in the ordinary course of its business but will sell as agent and bailee for the Supplier and the proceeds of sale of the Goods will be held by the Customer on trust for the Supplier absolutely.
39. The Customer's liability to the Supplier under the Contract will not be discharged by the operation of clause 38(d) (but its levels of indebtedness will be reduced by the extent of the funds so remitted to the Supplier).
40. The Customer agrees that whilst property and title in the Goods remains with the Supplier, the Supplier has the right, with prior notice to the Customer, to enter upon any premises occupied by the Customer (or any receiver, receiver and manager, administrator, liquidator or trustee in bankruptcy of the Customer) to inspect the Goods of the Supplier and, when payment is overdue, to immediately enter the premises (as the Customer's invitee) to repossess the Goods which may be in the Customer's possession, custody or control when payment is overdue.
41. The Customer will be responsible for the Supplier's reasonable costs and expenses in exercising its rights under clause 40 where the Customer is otherwise in default of the terms of the Contract. Where the Supplier exercises any power to enter the premises, that entry will not give rise to any action of trespass or similar action on the part of the Customer against the Supplier, its employees, servants or agents.
42. The Customer agrees that where the Goods have been retaken into the possession of the Supplier, the Supplier has the absolute right to sell or deal with the Goods, and if necessary, sell the Goods with the trademark or name of the Customer on those Goods, and the Customer hereby grants an irrevocable licence to the Supplier to do all things necessary to sell the Goods bearing the name or trademark of the Customer.
43. For the avoidance of doubt, the Supplier's interest constitutes a 'purchase money security interest' pursuant to the PPSA.
- Personal Property Securities Act**
44. The Customer acknowledges that by assenting to these Terms and Conditions, the Customer grants a security interest to the Supplier in all Goods (and their proceeds) now or in the future supplied by the Supplier to the Customer under the Contract.
45. The Customer undertakes to do anything that is required by the Supplier:
- so that the Supplier can acquire and maintain one or more perfected security interests under the PPSA in respect of the Goods and their proceeds;
 - to register a financing statement or financing change statement; and
 - to ensure that the Supplier's security position, and rights and obligations, are not adversely affected by the PPSA.
46. Unless the Customer has obtained the Supplier's prior written consent, the Customer undertakes not to:
- register a financing change statement in respect of a security interest contemplated or constituted by the Contract; and
 - create or purport to create any security interest in the Goods, nor register, or permit to be registered, a financing statement or a financing change statement in relation to the Goods in favour of a third party.
47. The Customer:
- waives its right under section 157 of the PPSA to receive a copy of the verification statement relating to a security interest created under the Contract;
 - agrees that to the extent permitted by the PPSA, the following provisions of the PPSA will not apply and are contracted out of: section 95 (to the extent that it requires the secured party to give notices to the grantor); section 96; section 118 (to the extent that it allows a secured party to give notices to the grantor); section 121(4); section 125; section 130; section 132(3)(d); section 132(4); section 135; section 142 and section 143; and
 - agrees that the following provisions of the PPSA will not apply and the Customer will have no rights under them: section 127; section 129(2) and (3); section 130(1); section 132; section 134(2); section 135; section 136(3), (4) and (5) and section 137.
48. The Customer agrees that it will, if requested by the Supplier, sign any documents, provide any information or do anything else the Supplier requests, to ensure that any security interest created in the Supplier's favour by the Contract is, to the fullest extent possible under the PPSA, perfected in accordance with Part 2.2 of the PPSA.
49. Notwithstanding section 275 of the PPSA, the parties agree to keep confidential all information of the kind referred to in section 275 of the PPSA, unless compelled by law to disclose such information.
50. The Customer irrevocably grants to the Supplier the right to enter upon the Customer's property or premises, with notice, and without being in any way liable to the Customer or to any third party, if the Supplier has cause to exercise any of its rights under sections 123 and/or 128 of the PPSA, and the Customer shall reasonably indemnify the Supplier from any claims made by any third party as a result of such exercise.
51. The Customer will be responsible for the Supplier's reasonable costs and expenses in exercising its rights under clause 50 where the Customer is otherwise in default of the Contract. Where the Supplier exercises any power to enter the premises, that entry will not give rise to any action of trespass or similar action on the part of the Customer against the Supplier, its employees, servants or agents.
52. The Customer agrees to accept service of any document required to be served, including any notice under the Contract or the PPSA or any originating process, by prepaid post at any address nominated in this application or any other address later notified to the Supplier by the Customer or the Customer's authorised representative.
53. The Customer further agrees that where the Supplier has rights in addition to those under part 4 of the PPSA, those rights will continue to apply.
- Security/charges**
54. The Customer charges in favour of the Supplier all of its estate and interest in any real property, whether held in its own right or as capacity as trustee, the Customer owns at present and in the future with payment of all monies which are now or in the future become owing to the Supplier whether pursuant to the Contract or otherwise until all such monies are paid in full by the Customer.
55. The Customer charges in favour of the Supplier all of its estate and interest in any personal property, whether held in its own right or as capacity as trustee, the Customer owns at present and in the future with payment of all monies which are now or in the future become owing to the Supplier whether pursuant to the Contract or otherwise until all such monies are paid in full by the Customer.
56. As security for the payment of the amount of its indebtedness to the Supplier from time to time, the Customer irrevocably appoints as its duly constituted attorney the Supplier's company secretary from time to time to execute in the Customer's name and as the Customer's act and deed any real property mortgage, bill of sale or consent to any caveat the Supplier may choose to lodge against real property that the Customer may own in any Land Titles Office in any state or territory of Australia, even though the Customer may not have defaulted in carrying out its obligations hereunder upon written notice and demand to the Customer (in the event that there is no default by the Customer in carrying out its obligations hereunder).
57. Where the Customer has previously entered into an agreement with the Supplier by which the Customer has granted a charge, mortgage or other security interest (including a security interest as defined in the PPSA) over or in respect of real or personal property, those charges, mortgages or other security interests and the terms which directly or indirectly create rights, powers or obligations in respect thereto will continue and co-exist with the obligations and security interests created in the Contract and will secure all indebtedness and obligations of the Customer under the Contract. The Supplier may, at its election and upon the provision of written notice, vary the terms of such previous charges, mortgages or other securities to reflect the Terms and Conditions herein.
- Agent capacity**
58. If the Customer acts as an agent for another party or parties (whether disclosed to the Supplier or not), the Customer warrants to the Supplier that:
- it holds current and proper authority to engage the Supplier on behalf of its principal(s);
 - any goods and/or services requested by the Customer are within the authority and financial limits authorised by the Customer's principal(s);
 - it holds sufficient funds to ensure payment of all amounts due and owing to the Supplier under this Agreement;
 - at the request of the Supplier, it will provide the name(s), address(es), and contact details of its principal(s); and
 - if the Supplier is not paid as and when payment is due as a result of a dispute between the Customer and its principal(s) regarding the Customer's authority, or if the Customer fails to hold sufficient funds in accordance with clause 58(c), then the Customer agrees to indemnify the Supplier for the amount due and owing, including any legal fees and expenses the Supplier incurs in order to enforce its rights, on an indemnity basis.
- Termination**
59. If the Customer defaults in the payment of any amount due to the Supplier pursuant to the Contract (including any deposit) and does not cure such default within seven (7) days after being given notice of such default, the Supplier may terminate the Contract (to be effective immediately) upon notice to the Customer.
60. Upon termination of the Contract in accordance with clause 59, all liabilities incurred by the Customer become immediately due and payable to the Supplier.
61. For the avoidance of doubt, termination of the Contract will not affect:
- the right of any party to whom money is owed hereunder at the time of termination to receive that money according to the provisions hereof; and
 - the rights and/or obligations pursuant to these Terms and Conditions which by their nature are intended to survive termination of the Contract.
- Trustee capacity**
62. If the Customer is the trustee of a trust (whether disclosed to the Supplier or not), the Customer warrants to the Supplier that:
- the Customer enters into the Contract in both its capacity as trustee and in its personal capacity;
 - the Customer has the right to be reasonably indemnified out of trust assets; and
 - the Customer has the power under the trust deed to enter into the Contract.
63. The Customer must give the Supplier a copy of the trust deed upon request.
- Insolvency**
64. If the Customer becomes insolvent, to the extent permitted by law, the Customer remains liable under the Contract for payment of all liabilities incurred. The Customer remains liable under the Contract even if the Supplier receives a dividend or payment as a result of the Customer being insolvent.
- Indemnity**
65. The Customer agrees to indemnify the Supplier in respect of all liability, claims, damage, loss, costs and expenses (including collection costs, debt recovery fees, and legal costs on an indemnity basis) that the Supplier may suffer or incur at any time, directly or indirectly, as a result of:
- damage to property or death of, or injury to, any person caused directly or indirectly by the Goods and/or in the course of performing the Services;
 - any claim against the Supplier in relation to any incident concerning the Goods or their use, operation, or storage; or
 - any default by the Customer in the performance or observance of the Customer's obligations under the Contract.
66. The Customer's liability to indemnify the Supplier will be reduced proportionally to the extent only that:
- any negligent act or omission by the Supplier or a breach of the Supplier's obligations under the Contract has contributed to the liability, claim, damage, loss, cost or expense which is the subject of the indemnity; or
 - these Terms and Conditions make the Supplier specifically liable for any cost or expense or rectifying or repairing any defect in, malfunction of or damage to the Goods.
67. The Customer's liability to indemnify the Supplier is a continuing obligation separate and independent from the Customer's other obligations and survives termination of the Contract.
68. It is not necessary for the Supplier to incur any expense or make any payment before enforcing its rights of indemnity conferred by these Terms and Conditions.
- Costs**
69. The Customer must pay for its own legal, accounting and business costs and all costs incurred by the Supplier relating to any default by the Customer under the Contract. The Customer must also pay for all stamp duty and other taxes payable on the Contract (if any).
70. The Customer will pay the Supplier's costs and disbursements incurred in pursuing any recovery action, or any other claim or remedy, against the Customer, including collection costs, debt recovery fees and legal costs on an indemnity basis.
71. Subject to clauses 72 and 73, payments by, or on behalf of, the Customer will be applied by the Supplier as follows:
- Firstly, in payment of any and all collection costs and legal costs in accordance with clauses 41, 51, 65, and 81.
 - Secondly, in payment of any interest incurred in accordance with clause 81.
 - Thirdly, in payment of the outstanding invoice(s), or part thereof in an order determined by the Supplier in its absolute discretion.

72. To the extent that payments have been allocated to invoices by the Supplier in its business records, the Supplier may, at its sole and unfettered discretion, allocate and/or retrospectively reallocate payments in any manner whatsoever at the Supplier's absolute discretion, including in a manner inconsistent with clause 71 herein.
73. Payments allocated (and/or reallocated) under clause 71 and/or 72 will be treated as though they were allocated (and/or reallocated) in the manner determined by the Supplier on the date of receipt of payment.
- Taxes and duty**
74. The Customer must pay GST on any taxable supply made by the Supplier to the Customer under the Contract. The payment of GST is in addition to any other consideration payable by the Customer for a taxable supply.
75. If as a result of:
- any legislation becoming applicable to the subject matter of the Contract; or
 - any changes in legislation or its interpretation by a court of competent jurisdiction or by any authority charged with its administration;
- the Supplier becomes liable to pay any tax, duty, excise or levy in respect of the amounts received from the Customer, then the Customer must pay the Supplier these additional amounts on 48 hours' written demand.
- Subcontracting and assignment**
76. The Supplier may engage a subcontractor without the approval of the Customer to perform all or any of its obligations under the Contract.
77. Neither party shall assign its benefits or obligations under the Contract without the written consent of the other (which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld).
- Accuracy of Customer Material**
78. The Customer warrants that any Customer Material provided to the Supplier is accurate and correct. The Supplier, to the extent permitted by law, accepts no liability for any loss, damage, costs or expense (including, for the avoidance of doubt, rectification costs) incurred by the Customer or by any third party as a result of the Customer Material being inaccurate or incorrect.
79. Where the Customer has provided Customer Material to the Supplier, the Customer grants the Supplier a non-exclusive license to use the Customer Material for the purposes of supplying the Services and warrants that the use of the Customer Material does not infringe the Intellectual Property Rights of any third party. Further, the Customer agrees to indemnify the Supplier against any claim arising from the use of the Customer Material, where such Customer Material infringes or is alleged to infringe the Intellectual Property Rights of any third party.
- Intellectual Property**
80. The Customer acknowledges that:
- the Supplier IP in existence at the date of the Contract is and will at all times remain the property of the Supplier;
 - the Supplier IP created or developed following the date of the Contract vests in the Supplier as soon as those Intellectual Property Rights are created or developed and will at all times remain the property of the Supplier; and
 - it has no rights under the Contract or otherwise to use Supplier IP except as set out in the Contract.
- Interest rates**
81. The interest rate on any outstanding debts is a fixed rate of ten (10) percent per annum, which interest will accrue and be recoverable each day or part thereof that the debt remains outstanding.
- Waiver**
82. A waiver of any provision or breach of the Contract by the Supplier shall only be effective if made by an authorised officer of the Supplier in writing. A waiver of any provision or breach of the Contract by the Customer shall only be effective if made by the Customer's authorised officer in writing. If the Supplier or the Customer elect not to enforce its rights arising as a result of a breach of the Contract, that will not constitute a waiver of any rights relating to any subsequent or other breach.
- Set-off**
83. All payments required to be made by the Customer under the Contract will be made free of any set-off, or counterclaim and without deduction or withholding, unless agreed to otherwise by the Supplier and the Customer in writing or as required by law.
84. Any amount due to the Supplier from time to time may be deducted from any monies which may be or may become payable to the Customer by the Supplier.
- Limitation of liability**
85. In relation to the supply of Goods, to the fullest extent permitted by law, the Supplier's liability to the Customer for any loss, damage or injury, whether under contract, in tort, pursuant to statute or otherwise, is limited to:
- the replacement of the Goods or the supply of equivalent Goods;
 - the repair of the Goods;
 - the payment of the cost of replacing the Goods or acquiring equivalent Goods;
 - the payment of the cost of having the Goods repaired.
86. In relation to the supply of Services, to the fullest extent permitted by law, the Supplier's liability to the Customer for any loss, damage or injury, whether under contract, in tort, pursuant to statute or otherwise, is limited to:
- the supply of the Services again; or
 - providing for the cost of having the Services supplied again.
87. The Supplier is not liable for loss of profit, economic or financial loss, consequential loss, loss of opportunity or benefit, loss of a right or any other indirect loss suffered by the Customer as a result of the Goods and/or Services supplied under the Contract.
88. All terms, conditions, warranties, indemnities and statements (whether express, implied, written, oral, collateral, statutory or otherwise) which are not expressly set out in the Contract are hereby expressly excluded and, to the extent they cannot be excluded, the Supplier disclaims all liability in relation to them.
- Liability of parties**
89. If two or more parties are included within the same defined term in these Terms and Conditions:
- these Terms and Conditions have separate operation in relation to each of them;
 - a liability or obligation of those persons under these Terms and Conditions is a joint liability or obligation of all of them and a several liability or obligation of each of them; and
 - a right given to those parties under these Terms and Conditions is a right given severally to each of them.
- Force majeure**
90. The Supplier is not liable to the Customer for any delay or failure to perform its obligations under the Contract if such delay or failure to perform is due to force majeure being a circumstance beyond its reasonable control, including strikes, lockouts, fires, floods, storm, riots, war, embargoes, civil commotions, supplier shortages, plant or mechanical breakdown, disease or pandemic, government intervention or regulation, acts of God or any other activity beyond the Supplier's control.
- Severance**
91. If any provision of these Terms and Conditions is not enforceable in accordance with its terms, other provisions which are self-sustaining are, and continue to be, enforceable in accordance with their terms.
92. If any part of these Terms and Conditions is invalid or unenforceable, that part is deleted and the remainder of these Terms and Conditions remain effective.
- Variation of Terms and Conditions**
93. The Customer agrees that these Terms and Conditions may be varied, added to, or amended by an authorised officer of the Supplier at any time by written notice to the Customer. Subject to clause 103, after fourteen (14) days of receipt of the written notice of the variation(s), the variation(s) will be deemed agreed by the Customer.
94. Any proposed variation to these Terms and Conditions by the Customer must be requested in writing. The Supplier may refuse any such request without providing reasons either orally or in writing.
95. Variations requested by the Customer will only be binding upon the Supplier if they are in writing signed by an authorised officer of the Supplier.
- Jurisdiction**
96. The Customer acknowledges and agrees that the Contract will be governed by the laws of Western Australia, and the laws of the Commonwealth of Australia which are in force in Western Australia.
97. The Customer acknowledges and agrees that any Contract between the Supplier and the Customer is formed at the address of the Supplier.
98. The parties submit to the non-exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of Western Australia and the relevant federal courts and courts competent to hear appeals from those courts.
- Entire agreement**
99. The Contract constitutes the entire agreement between the parties relating in any way to its subject matter, unless agreed to otherwise by the Supplier and the Customer in writing. All previous negotiations, understandings, representations, warranties, memoranda or commitments about the subject matter of the Contract are merged in the Contract and are of no further effect. No oral explanation or information provided by a party to another affects the meaning or interpretation of the Contract or constitutes any collateral agreement, warranty or understanding.
100. These Terms and Conditions shall apply to every Contract between the Supplier and the Customer. Any terms and conditions of the Customer's attached to the Order or of any other document deviating from or inconsistent with these Terms and Conditions are expressly rejected by the Supplier. For the avoidance of doubt, the Customer understands and agrees that these Terms and Conditions will prevail over, and the Supplier will not be bound by, any terms or conditions (express or implied) added or provided by the Customer, whether in an Order or otherwise, unless otherwise agreed in writing by the Supplier.
101. The Customer agrees to the terms of the Privacy Statement pursuant to the *Privacy Act 1988* contained in this document.

I/we, the Customer, acknowledge that I/we have had, or had the opportunity to obtain, independent legal advice in connection with this document and have read its contents in their entirety, understand its contents, and am/are executing this document free and voluntarily of my/our own will and with full capacity to do so.
